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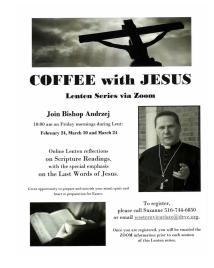
Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving

Our Lenten journey begins this week and through the three Pillars of Lenten observance -- *Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving*, we can dive deeper into our personal relationship with the Lord. Prayer is important in our every day life; however, Lent is a great opportunity to increase our prayer time, even to discover a new method of prayer, such as Lectio Divina or the St. Ignatian Daily Examen. Our parishes around our diocese offer a multitude of prayer services to engage in during our preparation of the risen Lord. What a wonderful way to join with our community of faith and to be a part of the living Body of Christ.

We are called to fasting because it is a spiritual and physical purification. We normally think of fasting with regard to giving up an indulgent food, but the "fast" can be a daily activity that may lead us away from God, such as watching a mindless TV show or spending time searching the web (other than for a good prayer). Our goal is to use time -- well spent, growing closer to God with a clear mind. A fast from an activity can also be used in service to others. Almsgiving is a wonderful way to show compassion and is a special way that we can reach out to those in need.

Our Church has embarked on the Eucharistic Revival and Lent is the perfect time to be a part of this movement designed to restore understanding and devotion to the great mystery of the Eucharist. Parishes in our diocese joined by other dioceses throughout our country have been and will offer events to rediscover the understanding of the Mass and true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Why is this so important -- by re-committing ourselves to the source and summit of our lives, we are fueled to meet the challenges to heal our world during these ever-changing difficult times. 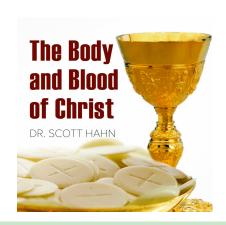
